Dear Friends,
I have been reading a classic text by Robert K. Greenleaf entitled, "Servant Leadership". First published in 1977, the essays that comprise the book were written during a time of great upheaval in our society. The prevailing attitude was "question authority" and every institution and organization within society was subject to rigorous critique.

One of Greenleaf's major themes is that, while it is easy to pull apart and criticize, it is much more difficult to contribute to the building up and improving of these institutions because such a contribution requires love. If you and I are members of such an entity, whether a business corporation, a school, college, or university, a non-profit, and/or a church or other religious community, and we want to see them working to bring about a better world, then we must be prepared to serve them in love. Now, genuine love is not a passive acceptance of everything that goes on in the life of the community we are serving. Instead, love is a genuine interest in, and commitment, to the

health, wellbeing, and improvement of that community, a genuine interest that is rooted in our concern for others, as opposed to our own self-interests and agendas.

I raise this perspective because the General Convention of the Episcopal Church will be meeting from July 8th until July 17th in Anaheim, CA.



The General Convention is the governing body of our national church that gathers every three years to consider the work we are doing in the name of Christ and to make decisions accordingly. You are well aware that these are challenging and difficult times for our tradition. There are differing points of view on several theological fronts that are creating conflict within this expression of Christ's Body. I suspect that whatever decisions are made at the convention will make some of us glad and will leave some

of us angry, disappointed, and/or confused.

What are we to do about it? Well, I want to suggest that we take Greenleaf's point seriously. You and I can love and serve our Church by praying daily for those attending the convention. We can study what is going on by way of the many websites available. Just plug "General Convention of the Episcopal Church" in your favorite search engine and watch the number of "hits" climb. I know the Diocese of Virginia will have regular updates on their website www.thediocese.net.

You and I, as members of Trinity Episcopal Church, can commit to loving God by way of loving each other and working together to try and understand what the Holy Spirit is saying to us in these challenging times, even as we patiently seek to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ and contribute to the building of God's kingdom here and now.

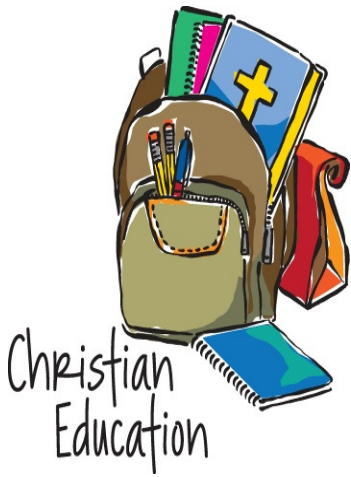

Middleburg FISH

A brief history

Quietly Helping our Neighbors

For immediate and sympathetic help

- In 1961 the FISH movement began in England as an all-volunteer group of Christians expressing practical love and concern for their neighbors.
- All Chapters are local. No two are the same. There is no central organization or headquarters. Each is geared to the needs of its particular community.
- In 1965 the Middleburg FISH was started by Rene Llewellyn, who also began Seven Loaves Food Bank and Windy Hill Foundation.
- Rene was joined by Peg Low as Treasurer, Florence Kaye as Newsletter Editor, and Nancy Manierre, who became “The Big Fish” when Rene retired.
- Annually, FISH helps about 250 people with temporary financial assistance for rent, medicine, utilities, and transportation.
- FISH has 25 volunteer telephone operators who answer calls for assistance.
- FISH has 18 volunteer drivers who take people to doctors, hospitals, and clinics for medical appointments.
- Middleburg's Emmanuel Church assists in coordinating the telephone operators.
- In 2009 calls for financial assistance have increased 60% over 2008.

On June 17, the Outreach Committee presented the following organizations to the Vestry for funding approval. The Vestry approved the recommendations unanimously.

- ESL Teacher for July thru Dec. \$2200
- MAP International - funding HIV/AIDS prevention program in Honduras: \$10,000
- Trinity Church College Scholarship Program - \$1,000 x 7 recipients: \$7,000
- Churches of Upperville – food baskets four times a year: \$1,000
- Loudoun Abused Women’s Shelter (LAWS) – playground for safe house: \$1,000
- Hospital Albert Schweitzer – medical care for uninsured in Haiti: \$500
- Windy Hill Foundation, Levis Hill House Endowment (senior housing rent subsidy) (our donation is eligible for matching funds): \$5,000. Our donation will be in memory of John Levis.

I personally would like to thank each member of the Outreach Committee and the Trinity sponsor for their time and talents to make these requests a reality. We encourage parishioners who are active in a worthwhile ministry to submit a proposal for consideration in our November funding cycle.

but are so reluctant to reveal their fears.

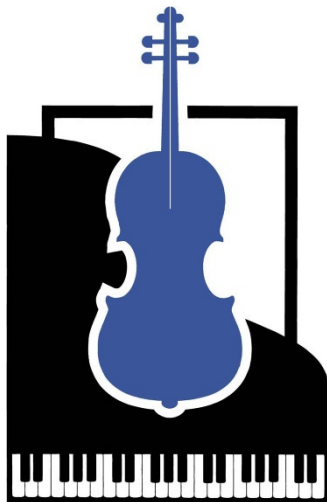
Priceless is the spouse who remains by your side,

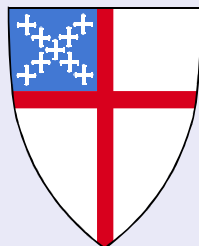

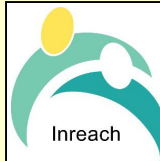
