# A CAPITAL CAMPAIGN - WHY HERE AND WHY NOW?

Since construction at Trinity was completed in 1960, the properties here have stood the test of time remarkably well. This is a testimony to their thoughtful design and fine construction. However, almost 65 years later, many of the installations, fixtures, and fittings are showing their age; many are well past their typical life span. This also presents us with a once-in-a-generation opportunity to modify, improve, and enhance our properties to incorporate the latest designs and technology; to meet current day coding requirements; to become more effective and efficient, so reducing operating costs; and to ensure that all of our properties are easily accessible to everyone who comes here.

For many years, repairs have been carried out – with increasing frequency – but we are now past the time of economical repairs. The time to fully Renew & Restore is now – to ensure that Trinity is fit for mission and ministry for years to come and to pass this beautiful place to the next generation in the best possible condition.



#### WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Renew & Restore seeks to raise \$10m in gifts and pledges to fully complete a comprehensive series of works across all the properties that make up the Trinity campus. Some of the major works include:

- New HVAC systems to Sanctuary and Cox Hall
- Restoration & conservation of church windows
- Replacement & renewal of water supply lines
- Replacement & renewal of electrical wiring to principal buildings
- Lighting renewal improvements & replacements
- Audio renewal improvements & replacements
- Redesign & renewal of access for ADA compliancy

- Remodeling and refurbishment of the Parish Office to provide additional accommodations
- Repairs to gutters, downpipes and external drainage
- Expert restoration of all decorative ironworks
- Refitting of restrooms in all buildings across the campus
- Extensive repairs to our historically important organ
- Enhancement of endowment funds to ensure an income sufficient to fully fund repair programs into the future

## AS YOU MAKE YOUR PLEDGE TO RENEW & RESTORE, PLEASE REMEMBER . . .

Payment may be made over a period of 36 months. If it is helpful, a longer payment period can be agreed upon.

Pledges are not legally binding, but rather are an indication of your intention.

Annual payments toward your pledge are deductible for tax purposes.

Pledge payments are in addition to your regular pledge for Annual Giving. Stewardship giving pays for the day-to-day life, work, and ministry of the Trinity, while your pledge in this campaign will be used specifically for Renew & Restore.
